

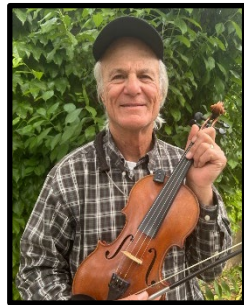

Just a few days ago, at the **Friends of Kenny Hall Jam**, we had what I believe was a record turnout of 27 musicians. It was good to have some out-of-town guests there: **Morgan Cochneur** from Petaluma and **Linda Emanuels** of Lemoore. Linda and late husband Steve were organizers of the **Old Time Fiddlers** in our area. There were also some new faces in the group so Kenny's jam, as **Mike Mueller** commented, continues to thrive. For as many persons of varying skill levels that were in the circle, it went quite well. Everyone seemed to have a great time. Historically, the jam's first meeting at the Santa Fe Basque began in 2003 and has met every Wednesday, except when summertime highs get around 100 degrees. Otherwise, we're there every week from 5-7 p.m. Also, at the most recent jam were five of the original persons who started the jam with Kenny: **Terry Barrett, Morgan Cochneur, Mike Mueller, Linda Guerrero, and Bill Lehr.** *(If I left someone out, this is my way of checking to see if anyone is reading my prez' message.)*

The Basque jam is an example of a community. A few weeks ago, one musician turned to me and said, "This is such a wonderful thing for me." True. Celebration of Life for Nancy Waidtlow

You are cordially invited to an event honoring Nancy Waidtlow on **Sunday, April 19, 1-5 p.m. at the Wolk Folk Garden, 6661 N Forkner**. Nancy, a long-time Folklore Society member, passed away in December. Nancy greatly loved folk music and attended many musical events at the Wolk Garden, so we want to honor her legacy with a potluck and lots of music at Pat’s place. The event is open to all music lovers, peace and social justice activists, and homeless advocates. Bring your favorite dish to share, and your voice or other instrument to help make music in remembrance of Nancy.

As many of you know, Nancy’s life was deeply rooted in the struggles for peace, social justice, human rights and gender equity during most of her 85 years on the planet. The last 15 years or so of her life were devoted to advocacy for the homeless, leading to her founding of the Dakota EcoGarden in 2013.

When Nancy witnessed, firsthand, how the City treated homeless people when they were evicting them from their encampments, she just couldn’t stand it. She resolved to do something about it. She attended some meetings with others working on the problem, but she did not want to just sit and talk about it. She wanted action, and she made it happen. After consulting with architect Arthur Dyson about a location, Nancy selected a property on West Dakota and went to work on what is now known as the Dakota EcoGarden (DEG).

In her mind, it was obvious what needed to be done to address homelessness. People who were unhoused needed some kind of housing right away so that they could get their lives back on track. With a safe, secure place to stay, people could start doing job searches and housing searches. They could work on resolving medical and/or addiction issues, even pursue an education.

The rest, as they say, is history. In its first 12 years of operation DEG housed over 170 otherwise unhoused people, many of whom were able to take advantage of their newly-acquired stability to move their lives forward. They used their stays at DEG to work on their issues and climb out of the abyss in which they found themselves. In August of 2023, on DEG’s 10th anniversary, the City of Fresno honored Nancy at a City Council meeting and issued a proclamation declaring August 10, 2023, as Dakota EcoGarden Day in the City of Fresno. That was one of many awards she received in her lifetime for her amazing life’s work.

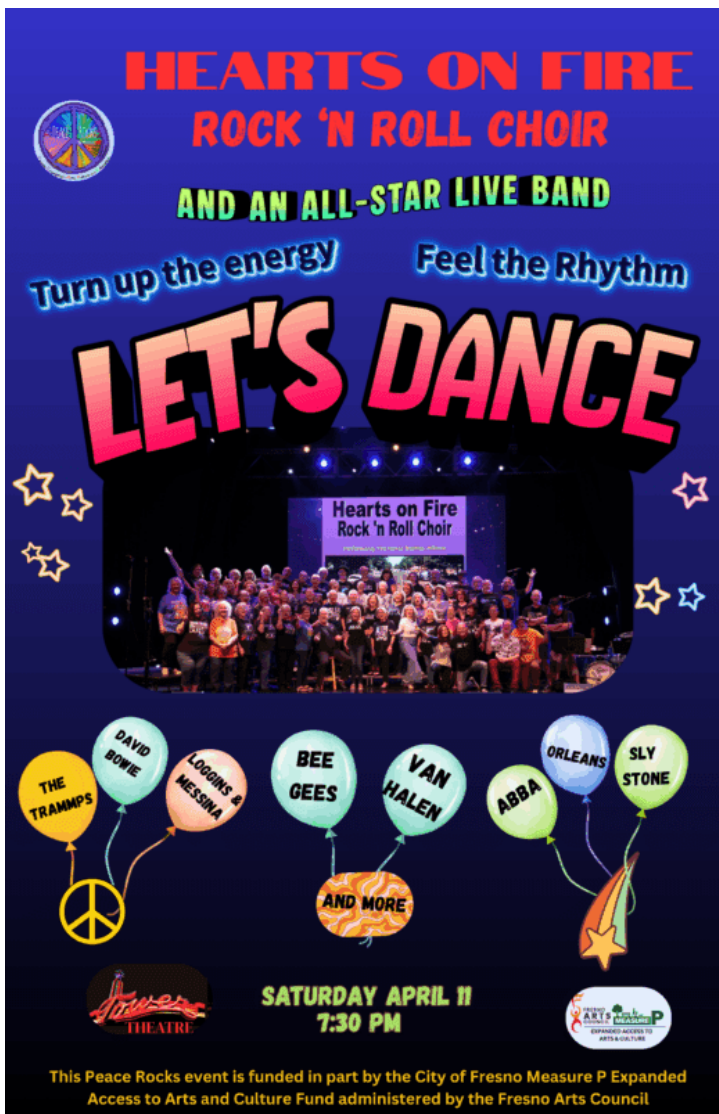

Get out and about and head down to the Santa Fe Basque. Honkey Tonk Jam happens on Mondays from 5 pm to 7 pm (but not when it is too hot or too cold). Be prepared to sing and play songs from the heyday of "real" country music. Wednesdays from 5 pm to 7 pm. is Kenny Hall's Friends Jam. Bring your instruments (tuned) and settle in for early evening music. If you don't know the tunes, you will learn as you go. Honkey Tonk does have some books made up by Sherron Brown, but Kenny's Friends is all by the seat of your pants. For those who have them, practice out of your Kenny Hall Songbooks. Other tunes are played as jams in round robin song circles. At a recent Kenny's Friends Jam, there were 29 players and 11 listeners. On the third Saturday of each month, the Old Time Fiddlers have a jam (not just fiddles) from 2 pm to 4 pm. These are all held on the South patio (through the bar). If you don't play, or are too shy, just listen, sing along, have dinner and drinks and enjoy yourself with friends. **(Sue Wirt)**

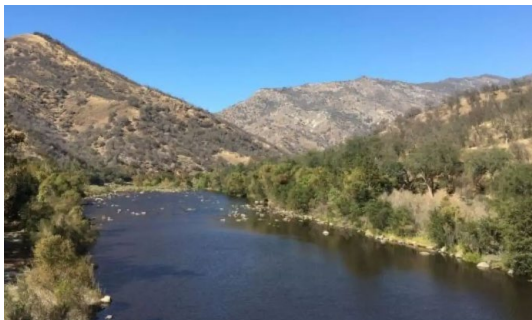

Kings River Jam Camp—April 30-May 3 (Thursday-Sunday)

Once again, we'll be camping at **Kirch Flat Campground** alongside the wild Kings River. There is no charge, but we ask that you RSVP if you plan on coming. Bring your camping gear, food, and whatever you want. Bring water although the river has lots of water in it for non-drinking purposes. Not a musician? Not a problem. You can listen. You can take walks to see the wildflowers, the birds, even fish the river or sit on the beach. Cold, rainy weather usually cancels our plans BUT the weather is usually really nice up there. Elevation is 1000 feet, so the weather is about the same as Fresno. Don't forget: RSVP and any questions to Ron Bohigian (rjbohig@gmail.com) so if plans change, we can contact you.



How to get there: Drive east from Fresno on Highway 180. Take a left onto Piedra Road and continue past Avocado Lake for about 35 miles around Pine Flat Lake to Kirch Flat Campground. Distance from Fresno is about 60 miles.
