## Bruce and Glen's Excellent Adventure, Pt. 2

We left Tulsa fulfilled from our visits to the Bob Dylan and Woody Guthrie Centers as well as to the museum honoring the Tulsa Race Massacre of 1921. An old friend from my school days picked us up and drove us to Kansas City, which is near where I grew up in Topeka, Kansas. Our objectives in KC were to take in the National Negro Leagues Baseball Museum which happens to share museum space with the American Jazz Museum, all at the infamous streets of Eighteenth and Vine, which was ground zero for the Kansas City jazz district back in the day. To explain, Kansas City was the first major city for blacks and working class folks looking for a better life, migrating north for work due to the Depression and the Jim Crow south. It was notable as one of the 'cradles of jazz' before even Chicago or New York. Kansas City was notoriously corrupt in the 20's, 30's and 40's, which allowed for a burgeoning jazz scene that basically never stopped 24/7 and produced such jazz greats as Charlie Parker, Count Basie, Big Joe Turner, Jay McShann, Benny Moten, Lester Young and Coleman Hawkins, Ben Webster and Mary Lou Williams. The KC Sound was based strongly in the blues so everyone took the blues form and made it swing.

Glen and I enjoyed both museums but he really wanted to see the Baseball Museum as he has always been active, even to this day, of playing and competing in fast pitch hardball. We saw all of his heroes and learned a lot about the checkered history of baseball and race in America. KC was the 'capital' of the negro leagues so it had its strongest presence there. If you watched Ken Burns' series on baseball, KC and the KC Monarchs figured prominently in that series. When the big leagues became integrated with the admission of Jackie Robinson in 1947, it meant the eventual dissolution of a separate negro baseball league.


While in KC, Glen was also surprised to find and take in the National World War I Museum. Glen's quite the history buff. Glen and I also got to jam one night and eat some famous KC barbecue.

So that completes our Excellent Adventure. We left KC and Tulsa saturated with more great history, lots of music from our heroes and great times with old friends.



**Fraydele Oysher**, sister of the famous cantor **Moische Oysher**, is one of 25 interviews in the book *Juliana and I made—Wind Blowing Across a Field* (available at [evoblustein.com](http://evoblustein.com)). I love her description of how she learned to be a great singer. One of twenty-five stories you will enjoy.

My dad's cousin Fraydele Oysher, the cantoress—girls weren't allowed to be trained like her famous brother Moische. When her father found out: "My papa exclaimed, 'What's going on here? Is that the gramophone?' 'No, I was singing.' 'That was you! When did you become a singer?' 'When Moische learned, I listened.' I sang him some of the liturgical music. When he heard that, he freaked out. I listened to everything that Moische was singing—whatever he and my father were doing, I just sat on the side and watched the little plants that were growing."



Formed in 1975, **Special Consensus** has become one of the most respected and enduring bands in bluegrass. Their impressive discography on Compass Records includes multiple Grammy and IBMA nominations, an IBMA Award for Video of the Year ("Alberta Bound"), and collaborations with leading voices across Americana and roots music. Known for their polished musicianship and heartfelt delivery, the band continues to inspire future generations while thrilling long-time fans. led by founding member and banjo master **Greg Cahill**, continues to bring their high-energy, harmony-rich sound to audiences across the country.

The band features **Greg Blake**, two-time IBMA Male Vocalist of the Year (2023 & 2025), on guitar and lead vocals, along with **Brian McCarty** (mandolin) and **Nico Humby** (bass).



Fresno has lost an iconic social justice crusader and beautiful soul- Nancy Waidtlow, who founded the **Dakota Eco Garden** in 2012 as a place to give not just shelter to homeless individuals but a new start in life. Nancy took her retirement and bought the house on a large lot on Dakota, which eventually incorporated Art Dyson's Eco Village concept, a series of eco friendly shelters built in harmony with nature. A small volunteer board with Gerry Bill (Nancy's partner) at the helm keeps the Dakota house running.

Housing approximately thirteen - fifteen people at a time, with an organic garden, well over a hundred residents have been taken off the streets and given a safe, environmentally friendly place to move forward with their lives, due to Nancy's vision and generosity. Funded entirely by community groups, churches and individuals, the Dakota Eco Garden is a shining example of what a difference one person can make. **(Dixie Salazar)**

I first remember Nancy at a Folklore Potluck where I was holding our new baby Emily. Nancy was there with her two kids who were elementary age at least. She took some time to talk to me about the joys and difficulties of having a newborn. I was very interested in everything she had to say! I saw that the intergenerational aspect of the FFS was going to be a very good thing.

In these last few years Susan Heidebrecht and Nancy co-hosted a song circle in their backyards, every Friday. This grew out of the singing that happened at potlucks and The Mill, and we had many hours of happiness singing all of our favorite songs together. Nancy had taught elementary school and sang with her students each day. She was a strong leader! And her harmony singing added a lovely element to our group. As she became more ill, we had more opportunities to give her a little assistance and to sing her praises and say goodbye. I deeply appreciate the Folklore Society for making our community such a supportive space. And I thank Nancy for her example of a rich life, well lived. **(Kathryn Johnsen)**

The Washington Post described John as folk music's "Rustic Renaissance Man," a moniker flawed only by its understatement. "Calling John McCutcheon a 'folksinger' is like saying Deion Sanders is just a football player..." (Dallas Morning News). Besides his usual circuit of major concert halls and theaters, John is equally at home in an elementary school auditorium, a festival stage or at a farm rally. He is a whirlwind of energy packing five lifetimes into one. In the past few years alone he has headlined over a dozen different festivals in North America (including repeated performances at the National Storytelling Festival), recorded an original composition for Virginia Public Television involving over 500 musicians, toured Australia for the sixth time, toured Chile in support of a women's health initiative, appeared in a Woody Guthrie tribute concert in New York City, gave a featured concert at the Smithsonian Folklife Festival, taught performance art skills at a North Carolina college, given symphony pops concerts across America, served as President of the fastest-growing Local in the Musicians Union and performed a special concert at the National Baseball Hall of Fame. This is all in his "spare time." His "real job," he's quick to point out, is father to two grown sons.


